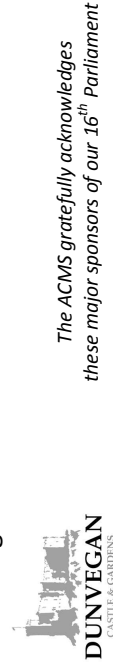
Please note that there have been some changes to the programme to

There are four main tracks in the visit to Assynt, as previously announced in the Clan MacLeod:

- SEGMENT A1: HISTORY
- SEGMENT A2: GEOLOGY
- SEGMENT B1: COMMUNITY ACTIVISM AND GOVERNANCE
- SEGMENT B2: ON THE WATER

There have been some changes in the programme, several are noted below:  
 • Kerrachar Gardens have been for sale for a while, and a few months ago it changed hands. The former owners, Peter and Trisha Kohn, had made special arrangements for us to visit through a programme of the Scottish Horticultural Society. However, it turned out that the new owners wished to take possession of the property much sooner than expected, so we are not about to visit. However, we will be taking the Statesman Cruise from Kylesku out into Loch Glendhu, and be able to visit the tallest waterfall in Britain.

- A box lunch on Thursday is included with your registration. This will be eaten en-route on the B869.
- Friday, you will purchase your lunch, but you have the option of either another box lunch, or eating in the pub of the Kylesku Hotel, next to the ferry landing.



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## THE BUS SCHEDULE

### OUTBOUND FROM DUNVEGAN TO INCHNADAMPH

TIME	EVENT
17:00	Depart Dunvegan Hall.
18:00	Depart from bus stop in Kyle of Lochalsh.
20:30	Stop in Ullapool for dinner, if the riders want to do that. We have no riders to pick up in Ullapool.
21:30	Approximate arrival in Inchnadamph if we don't stop of dinner.
22:30	Approximate arrival in Inchnadamph if we do stop for dinner.

The bus station in Kyle is behind and below the Tourist Centre. It is a short walk from the train station (about 100 yards).

Note that cars can be parked and left overnight at no charge in the public lots at either the Tourist Centre or the Leisure Centre in Kyle.

- The Tourist Centre is heavily marked, and you will see the signs as you approach the Skye Bridge on the A87. The parking lot surrounds the Tourist centre, on both an upper level (with the Tourist Centre building) and a lower level (on the same level as the bus station).
- The Leisure Centre lot can be found by exiting the upper level Tourist Centre lot and bearing left to return to the A87 BUT take an IMMEDIATE right onto Main Street – you will turn right in front of the Bank of Scotland building, on the corner. As you now head down Main Street, you will see signs directing you to the Leisure Centre/Pool. Follow these signs. The parking lot will be on your right. (While it doesn't have a big sign announcing that it is a parking lot but you will recognise parking spaces.) There is a set of green metal stairs at the far end of the parking lot that will take you back up to the village street level, where you can walk back to the Tourist Centre and bus stop.

### INBOUND FROM INCHNADAMPH TO DUNVEGAN

TIME	EVENT
10:00	Depart Inchnadamph Hotel.
About 12:30	Stop for quick lunch.
14:00	Stop to leave anyone off in Kyle of Lochalsh.
15:00	Arrival at Parliament registration in Dunvegan Hall.



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## THURSDAY 22 JULY

TIME	EVENT
09:00	Depart Inchnadamph Hotel for the Assynt Visitors' Centre.
10:00	Depart Assynt Visitors' Centre to visit major historical monuments. These include the Inchnadamph Church, Ardreck Castle, and Calda House.
noon	At about noon, we will break for lunch near Clachtoll, with a packed meal from Inchnadamph. Weather permitting, it will also be possible for some seaside walking nearby in Stoer.
14:00	We will be joined at Clachtoll by our guide from the Highland Rangers. Further historical sites we will pass include Clashmore, Clashnessie, Culkein, and Drumbeg. We will try to appreciate the significance of the UNESCO Geopark designation for this vast area.
16:00	Sometime after 16:00 we will return to Inchnadamph.
19:00	Arrive at the Inchnadamph Hotel. Cash bar.
19:30	Dinner is served.

### THE ASSYNT VISITORS' CENTRE

This is more than a typical tourist information point as it is also the office for the highland rangers and other groups operating in the area. There is an extraordinary amount of information available, and it is truly the best place to begin an exploration of Assynt. You will also note that there is a real synergy among the various community groups, who are working together to renew and develop the area.

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## FRIDAY 23 JULY 2010

TIME	EVENT
09:00	Depart Inchnadamph Hotel for a brief tour of several development sites in Lochinver Village.
10:00	Arrive Glencanisp Lodge. Adam Pellant will give us an overview of the acquisition of the Estate and the plans for the Lodge, which was recently refurbished.
12:00-14:00	Lunch at either the Kylesku Hotel or a packed meal from Inchnadamph.
14:00	We will board the Statesman ferry at the pier adjacent to the Hotel. .
16:00	Sometime after 16:00 we will begin the return trip to Inchnadamph.
17:00	Return to Inchnadamph.
17:30	Minibus shuttle into Lochinver begins, and continues until 10:00PM. (Last pass through Village is at 10:00PM.)

### OUR LOCHINVER STROLL

### EAS A'CHUAL ALUINN WATER FALL

Kylesku sits at the juncture between Loch A Chairn Bhain and Loch Glencoul. At 650 feet, Eas a'Chual Aluinn is Britain's highest waterfall.

### LOCHINVER LARDER

Lochinver Larder is a licensed restaurant situated in the village of Lochinver on the river Inver estuary as you enter on the A837.

The dining room to the rear looks out over the river and the estuary. It is owned and run by Ian and Debra Stewart. The Larder also has a range of homemade pies that can be eaten in or taken away. All food is freshly made on the premises from the best Scottish ingredients wherever possible.

It is also a boutique gift shop with a range of local pottery made by Fergus Stewart, and also has a range of crafts, scents and a selection of books to read.

### THE CULAG HOTEL

The Culag Hotel is situated at the pier at the far end of the village, near the working harbour. It was once the home to the Duke of Sutherland. It is now in private ownership, and serves as a hotel and bar. Offering a selection of foods and drink, they have a very large collection of malts.
