# THE ALTANDHU COLLECTION

## INTRODUCTION

What started as a few books and Clan Magazines, has become a library of over three hundred books, a growing collection of Clan Magazines, and should ultimately contain, MP3 audio and MP4 Video records of music and talks relating to the Clan MacLeod. The name Altandhu, (Blackwater) relates to the name of the hamlet where the earliest known progenitor of my family line lived, a small collections of croft cottages on the coast line of Coigeach. Coigeach is one of the four original MacLeod mainland territories, and sits opposite the Summer Isles, looking out over the Minch to the Long Island.

The concept of having a well documented collection of MacLeod reference material is essential if the heritage is not to be lost with time. In very few places are such collections available. There is a library at Dunvegan Castle, and The Dame Flora Memorial Collection at Old Dominion University in Virginia, and Donald B. MacLeod of Manhattan left a fine collection of his books to his family in Prince Edward Island. Recently, the efforts of William M. Woodall have resulted in the placement of a Clan MacLeod U.S.A. Lending Library at the Harwood Library in Taos, New Mexico, although borrowing the books on inter library loan can be painfully slow if possible at all. But I believe that similar collections of books should be established in each country where the Clan society is organized, so that the serious student may have the necessary resources to pursue the subject. Ultimately an on line digital source should be accessed from a clan website repository where the scanned documents can be retrieved in an unmodified manner. I say unmodified, for some fearful changes to original texts seems almost inevitable in these days of woke ideology.

I have therefore made it my intention to promote the interest in such libraries, by distributing a list of the contents of the Altandhu Collection in the hopes that others will be inspired to replicate the collection, and discover the whereabouts of 'MacLeod books' in their countries. It would also be a pleasure to assist in finding books through the known book dealers.

The current collection includes many quite rare and precious books, among them "The Book Of Dunvegan" Vols. I + II, "Prince Charlie's Pilot", Alex MacKenzie's "History of The MacLeods" and Rathbone's "Dunvegan Castle". The relatively recent acquisition, coveted ever since I saw it on Norman Of Suardal's Library shelf is "Brave Sons Of Skye". Another is the original Gaelic Bible, the personal property of Dr. Norman MacLeod D.D., personally inscribed to him, and containing a record in his own hand of significant family events. This book I donated to the Master's Seminary Museum at Grace Community Church in Sunland, California, where it may possibly be of more use to theological students.

As other books relating to the MacLeods are discovered, a search is mounted to acquire a copy for the Altandhu Collection. In this manner the collection continues to grow as a valuable reference source.

Built by Archibald Norman McLeod, (d. ca.1838) a famous Nor'Wester, in 1805, Dunvegan had a striking location, precipitous hills rising 185 meters behind the Fort and the wide romantic Peace River in front. Fort Dunvegan was the center of trade for the Beaver Indians, and with the amalgamation of the North West and Hudson's Bay Companies in 1821, the fort continued in its dual role of trading fur and supplying meat.
